Stacy has worked on various task forces, clubs, and commissions, including the ND Human Trafficking Task Force, the ND Humanities Council, the Rotary Club to End Human Trafficking, Rotarian Action Group Against Slavery, ND Attorney General's Human Trafficking Commission, ND Human Rights Coalition, and engaged in the Not for Sale Campaign. She has been named the Top 20 Under 40 and is known as one of Bismarck's Hidden Hometown Heroes.

Jenise Wilson is the Executive Director of the North Dakota Counseling Association and also serves as a counselor in the Bismarck/Mandan community for survivors of trauma and human trafficking. Jenise also teaches fulltime at the University of Mary in the Graduate Counseling Program. She has served on anti-human trafficking efforts and advocated for survivors since 2016. Jenise completed her Ph.D. dissertation on counseling survivors of human trafficking in 2020. She has served as the president of the Invisible Innocence Council and currently volunteers her time to the 31:8 Project.
